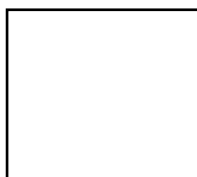

## CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Conference provides up to 12.5 hrs. of continuing education and the Institutes provide an additional 4 hrs. of continuing education for the professional categories listed below.

**Attorneys:** AFCC California is a Multiple Activity Provider with the California State Bar for general and family law specialization continuing legal education credit (MCLE & LSCLE).
